Introductions Completed

- 1. Jim Sebry moved the July 7th meeting minutes approved. Christine Frandsen seconded. CARRIED.
- 2. Agenda moved approved by Tim Thoreson. Tom Simpson seconded. CARRIED.
- 3. Reports:
 - a. Archery- Wind up is at 2pm on the 21st of August. We have been getting an average of 10 shooters per night.

- g. Environment- Pigeon lake does not have blue algae yet.
- h. Predator- There was a grizzly that was relocated at Cochrane after it killed some chickens in a pen. The grizzly returned and had to be put down.

- r. Youth Programs- We had last minute cancellations and would like to know how to deal with them...should they be given a refund?
 - After discussion the general consensus was to offer to carry forward to the next year. A vote was done by the youth at camp on who was an outstanding student that met the qualities listed by the counselors and \$250 that was donated from the Millet Fish & Game for kid's camp was refunded to the chosen youth. The remaining \$250 will be used at next year's camp.
 - Three youth did not pass the exam. Two have since re-wrote and passed. One left to rewrite it before the end of the month.
