Meeting called to order at 7:30pm

Introductions Completed

3. Reports:

- a. Archery- Two shooters came for Archery last night. The weather was miserable.
- b. Banquet- Nothing to report.
- c. Casino- Nothing to report.
- d. Big Game- Ray Abt presented information on chronic wasting disease. The article can be found on the Alberta Fish & Game website.
- e. Membership- we have reached 681members

- f. Bird/Fish- <u>Dale Jess made a motion to purchase 500, 4"- 6" trout to stock in the lake provided we can check the existence of our current stock first. Dave Abt Seconded. CARRIED.</u>
- .g. Environment- Tom Simpson and Leonard Davis attended the Chain Lakes meeting.

They provided information from ASRD's netting report.

First Chain Lake averaged 37 Pike per net and some suckers 40-60cm long.

Second Chain Lake averaged 14 fish per net. The oldest fish were 6 to 7 years old.

Water test on the first lake was the worst. All lakes have declined rapidly since 2001 due to fertilizer filtering down from First Chain Lake. They were shown pictures of the disturbance at the second Chain Lakes entrance.

- i. Predator- Tim Thoreson presented safety tips from Alberta Parks. Including tips on caring for spider and tick bites.

There was a cat sighting on the east side of Gull Lake at Meridian Beach.

j. Property- Discussed May 2nd clean up and what needs to be done on May 9th clean up.

The dock needs to be put in. Need to pressure wash BBQ area. Leonard will check into getting a Hotsy washer.

Beaver Dams cannot be blown until July 1st. We must follow time lines and regulations for creeks

and rivers. Ray will print a map from SRD for our property.

k. Rental-Last year the R.C.M.P. paid for the rental but not for the membership.

The Fee has been upped to \$300 per day this year. They have booked June 8th and 12th.

Leonard Davis will do the shotgun forms up for them.
